He has acted as legal advisor to the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights in the Awas Tingni case, a central precedent under international law relating to the rights of indigenous peoples. Todd also led in the development of the Pro Bono Declaration of the Americas, a declaration of the legal profession's public service responsibilities signed by 500 law firms across South and North America. He has participated as an organizer and speaker at public interest conferences in Bogota, Buenos Aires, Lima, Madrid, Mexico, New York, Santiago and São Paulo and elsewhere. He is also a frequent speaker on private equity, capital markets and emerging markets and has co-authored several papers.



Originally from the American South, Todd lived in Spain for ten of his first 20 years. Todd received his B.A., *magna cum laude*, in 1987 from Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama, where he was student body president, his *License d'histoire* in 1988 from the Université de Paris-Sorbonne (Paris IV), where he was a Rotary Scholar, and his J.D. in 1991 from Columbia University School of Law, where he was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar.
